2024 was a milestone year for us – the first under our new 2024–2028 Strategic Plan, which will guide our work and impact for years to come.

This plan is anchored in four strategic pillars:

It was the combination of patience, expert care, and compassion that brought Frank back to life. When he was ready, he found a loving family that embraced him completely and continued the care he needed.


Today, Frank is thriving in his forever home. His coat is shiny, his allergies are under control, and his days are filled with comfort, joy, and unconditional love.

Because of you, Frank's story is one of healing, hope, and a new beginning.



Hearts Behind The Mission

Meet Mark Underhill, a dedicated volunteer since 1995.



Since 1995, Mark has been a quiet force behind the scenes at LAWS-doing the kind of work that often goes unseen but makes all the difference.

If you've ever dropped by on a Saturday, chances are Mark gave you a tour. He knows the cats by name, their quirks, and their stories—and he's more than happy to share them with anyone who walks through the door.

Mark's journey with LAWS began after volunteering with youth programs in Peterborough. When that work ended, he looked for a new way to give back. Lucky for us, he found LAWS.

Today, Mark volunteers five days a week. He cleans animal condos, walks and socializes dogs, handles the donation bins, takes out the garbage, and—when the shelter is short-staffed—steps up without hesitation.

Recently, he even added Tuesday and Thursday afternoons to his regular schedule to help manage a rush of puppies and walk-in visitors.

His love for the animals is palpable. "Just being around them, playing with them, cuddling them—it's the best part," he says. Mark's own rescue dog, a 145-pound Lab-Mastiff who was saved from a brutal dog-fighting situation, is now a well-loved senior, turning 16 this year.

Beyond the tasks and the tours, Mark embodies the spirit of LAWS-compassionate, reliable, and wholly dedicated to animal welfare. As Director of Operations, Lyndsay puts it, "If something needs to be done, Mark does it-because he knows it means something good for the animals."

When asked why others should volunteer, Mark keeps it simple: "Because it's a great shelter."

Thank you, Mark, for showing us what it means to

Bruce and Shirley Whitney: Fostering Hope, One Paw at a Time

When Shirley Whitney reached out to LAWS during the early days of the pandemic, she was simply looking for a way to help. "I thought I'd like to go play with the kittens," she recalls. Instead, she and her husband Bruce were asked if they'd consider fostering. They said yes – and haven't looked back.

Since then, the Whitneys have fostered more than 40 cats and kittens, including pregnant moms and fragile newborns needing weeks of care. Their home has become a place of healing, love, and fresh starts for some of the shelter's most vulnerable animals.

Their involvement with LAWS quickly deepened. Bruce served a full term on the Board of Directors and for the past three years has coordinated LAWS team of volunteers at Delta Bingo, a vital source of fundraising revenue. Shirley quickly joined the team. Together, they also contribute generously as donors, offering both time and financial support to help ensure every animal gets the care they need.

Their impact ripples outward. Friends, neighbours, and fellow community members have been inspired by their example – donating, adopting, or stepping in to help. One friend was so moved by a rescue experience that she made a donation on the spot and has adopted two of the elderly cats needing care in their final years. Shirley and her friend are also strong supporters of the LAWS Thrift Store, both in their donations and promoting the shop to others. Shirley is also exploring a fundraising concert in LAWS name.

Among their many fosters, one kitten named William holds a special place in their hearts – sick and fragile when he arrived, he spent six months recovering with the Whitneys before going to a loving home.

Bruce and Shirley are part of a remarkable community of fosters, volunteers, and donors who make the work of LAWS possible every day. Their story is just one of many that reflect the care, generosity, and dedication that keep tails wagging and hearts full at LAWS.
